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1. A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Damdama College, established on August 9, 1978, in the historic town of Hajo, Assam, has developed into a respected academic institution. Situated in the vibrant area of Kulhati, the college spans 44 bighas and offers access via well-connected roads. The nearest railway station is Kamakhya Railway Junction, approximately 31 km away, while Lokapriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport at Borjhar is located about 38 km from the campus.

In its formative years, Damdama College attracted distinguished faculty, including Professor Dr. Gobinda Ch. Deka, a prominent scientist, and the late Professor Tarinikanta Bhattacharya, former Principal of Cotton College, who inaugurated the college's classes. Notably, contributions from local academic figures like Mr. Bonkim Sharma, the retired Principal of Damdama H.S. School, and Mr. Pramod Ch. Deva Sharma Shastri significantly fostered a culture of democratic and liberal humanism within the institution.

A historical overview of the college includes its initial dependence on Damdama H.S. School, which permitted college students to utilize its classrooms for lectures. Classes commenced on January 2, 1982, in improvised settings as faculty and students gathered bamboo and other materials to create temporary facilities. Degree courses were initiated under Gauhati University in 1984, and the institution was designated a Grants-in-Aid college in 1989, followed by provincialization in 2005. Recently, in March 2023, the college was evaluated by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), achieving a B grade in its second cycle of assessment.

The college's strength lies in its academic excellence and supportive environment, catering to local students predominantly from agro-based working-class backgrounds. This necessitates a nuanced managerial approach to foster growth and development. A dedicated faculty, along with committed non-teaching personnel, creates a nurturing environment that enables students to harness their potential in an intellectually vibrant atmosphere. The college strives to provide holistic education aimed at empowering students as global citizens.

6. RESERVATION RULES

1. **There is a provision for reservation of seats, as per Government of Assam rules for the candidates belonging to the State of Assam. In this respect, caste certificate issued by the competent authority under Government of Assam only shall be valid**
2. **A maximum 5% of the total seats may be earmarked for students having outstanding performance in Extra Curricular Activities (Sports/Cultural/NCC/ Scouts & Guides) and wards of employees of the College. A screening committee is formed by the College to select the candidates for admission under ECA category.**
3. **There is a provision of reservation of 3% of the total seats for 'Differently abled' candidates under PWD category. Candidates seeking admission under ECA and PWD categories must produce his/her original documents on a date to be notified later after admission**

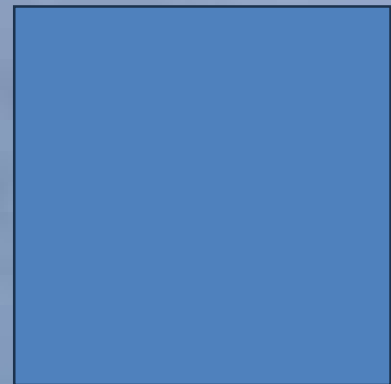


11. Grievance Redressal Cell & Internal Complaints Committee
